In June we had the opportunity to meet Rescue Ink while they were in Milwaukee for a Brew City Bully Club event. We were honored to hang out with the toughest member of the bunch, Jordan, here is her story.

Jordan's Story

Rescue Ink is a bunch of tattooed, motorcycle-riding tough guys who stand up for animals that are abused and neglected. Sometimes, we confront abusers by knocking – loudly – on their doors, or -- if we're lucky, and they're not -- by catching them in the middle of some heinous act. But other times, we're left to pick up the pieces of abuse and neglect, long after an animal has been abandoned and left for dead.

In March, a little white ball of fluff was taken to New York's CACC. The 4-week-old female Maltese mix had been found on the streets of Brooklyn, barely weaned from her mother. There was something very, very wrong with her: Her eyes bulged, her back legs were underdeveloped, and she could not walk.

Rescue Ink named our new addition Jordan – after our newest recruit, a New York City fireman and extreme fighter – and Mary, our resident den mother who has a soft spot for disabled toy dogs, took her to a veterinary neurologist. An ultrasound revealed fluid on the brain – hydrocephalus – and X-rays of her lower back led to a very serious diagnosis: spinal bifida.

Despite her obvious handicaps, Jordan is a joyful, active dog, full of typical puppy energy and mischief. Handicapped Pets donated a custom-made wheelchair for her, and Jordan models it at every chance. Maybe not surprisingly, most times you can find her in the arms of her namesake, whose steely exterior belies his tender spot for underdogs within.
